NE EDMONTON EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT COALITION

You may have heard the expression: "It takes a village to raise a child." The "village" that surrounds our young children makes a HUGE difference to the kinds of opportunities and resources available during the first years of their life. The Early Childhood Coalitions of Alberta seek to help build and support children's "villages" Their focus is on helping us, as a community, to do the best job of providing our young children with what they need to thrive. Did you know that there are seven (7) Early Years Coalitions in Edmonton, and just short of 100 Coalitions across Alberta?

We would like to introduce you to the NE Edmonton Early Childhood Development Coalition. Most young children living in NE Edmonton are doing well. However, research (using the Early Development Instrument) has shown that nearly one third (1/3) face challenges that leave them vulnerable in one or more developmental areas. These challenges can range from not having the food and proper clothing to prepare them for a day of learning to not having the opportunities to practice important skills. This can result in delays in their development or make it difficult for them to engage fully in the learning environment of a Kindergarten class.

We are a group of people who want to change this. So, what are we doing to build the capacity of our communities to support young children's development and reduce the percentage of children who are vulnerable? First, we share knowledge and information. Second, we bring people together. We believe that the more informed and connected that people are, the more we can be a resource to each other and the stronger the "village" will become.

- <u>Household Hazardous Waste</u> please take to an <u>Eco</u> <u>Station</u>. They will be accepted at no cost.

Community Patrol - Summer 2019

Our area has certainly had increase of break and enters, theft of license plates, mischief. Belvedere was #3 for break enters April 22-28. Always remember to report as soon as you can. Call non-emergency line 780-423-4567 or mobile #377. Can report using online reporting. Every file is reviewed and analyzed for trends.

Some good tips to think about coming in the summer months ahead. Always ensure that your tools, ladders are put away and shed/garage are locked up after yard work. Lock the front door if working in the back and the back door if working in the front. If you are not in view of the open shed or garage lock it, many roam our alleyway and streets.

Trim greenery for visibility for your doors. Motion sensor lighting is good to have in the yard. Keep safe do not let people in to borrow a phone, check your furnace, water lines, id them. At night make it habit that gates, garage doors, and shed are locked.

Parking outside – lock car doors and do up the windows, in the morning walk around your vehicle look inside and ensure the license plate is there and intact, not changed or missing stickers year/ month.

Month of April there were 34 crimes reported in Belvedere 5 Assaults, 11 Break and Enters, 1 Robbery, 11 Theft from vehicles, 5 theft of vehicle and 1 theft over \$5000.00. Week of April 22 -28 we ranked #3 for break and enters in Edmonton.

Up to May 20 there have been 16 crimes reported 4 Assaults, 3 Break and Enters, 7 theft from vehicles, 1 theft of vehicle and 1 theft over \$5000.00.

Signs of illegal activity

If a property is being used for illegal activity you may notice some common signs.

Seeing one of these signs doesn't always mean illegal activity is going on, but if they happen often or together, a problem may exist.

Some common signs of illegal activity include:

- frequent visitors at all times of the day and night
- frequent late night activity
- extensive home security
- residents that are rarely seen, distant or secretive
- windows blackened or curtains always drawn
- neglected property and yard
- people repeatedly visiting the property who only go to the door for a short time
- residents who regularly meet vehicles near the property for a short time
- strange odours coming from the house or garbage
- garbage that contains numerous bottles and containers, particularly chemical containers
- putting garbage in a neighbour's collection area

If there's a suspicious property in your neighbourhood, don't investigate it or approach its residents. You can safely and confidentially report a suspicious property through SCAN.


