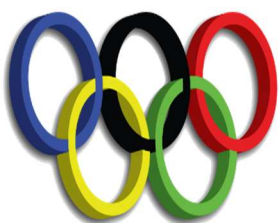

February 6 to 12 2022 Burn Awareness Week

In 2021, Edmonton experienced more than 130 cooking-related fires. These fires caused over \$4.8 million in damages. Learn about cooking safety and how to reduce the risk of fire.

Hot surfaces damage skin. Here's how you can prevent contact burns around the home.

Hot Appliances / Cooking Burns

- Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries in Edmonton.
- Always use oven mitts or potholders to remove hot items from the stove or microwave.
- Use the back burners of the stove to prevent children from reaching up and touching hot pots and pans.
- Have a “kid-free zone” of at least 3 feet around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.
- Never hold a child while you are cooking, drinking a hot liquid, or carrying hot foods or liquids.
- If you are overly tired, have consumed alcohol or medication, do not use the stove or stovetop.
- After cooking, check the kitchen to make sure all burners and appliances are turned off.
- Cooking oil combusts at high temperatures. Stay alert when cooking with oil and do not carry the pot or pan if a fire starts. Carefully slide a lid or cookie sheet over the flame to smother it. Do not try to douse the flame with water.
- If a fire starts in the oven, turn off the heat and leave the door closed.

REPORT A CRIME ONLINE

Online reporting is a convenient reporting option that can provide you with a copy of the police report and a file number. Reportable crimes that can be submitted online are:

- **Sexual assault** (If you are 16 or older at the time of reporting and the event occurred more than seven days ago.)
- **Break and enter** (i.e. Entered detached garage/shed/fenced compound.)
- **Damage to property** (i.e. Rock thrown through a house window)
- **Damage to a vehicle** (i.e. Slashed tires; keyed exterior of vehicle)
- **Lost property** (i.e. Leaving personal items in a restaurant, lost wallet/purse)
- **Theft from vehicle, under \$5,000** (i.e. Stolen stereo, auto accessories, vehicle parts stolen from a vehicle)
- **Theft under \$5,000** (i.e. Stolen bike, cell phone or personal property)

Online reporting does not replace other forms of crime reporting; if you are not comfortable reporting an incident online, you can still attend a police station, call 780-423-4567 or dial #377 from your mobile device. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, dial 780-425-1231.

If this is a life-threatening situation or a crime in progress, dial **9-1-1** immediately.

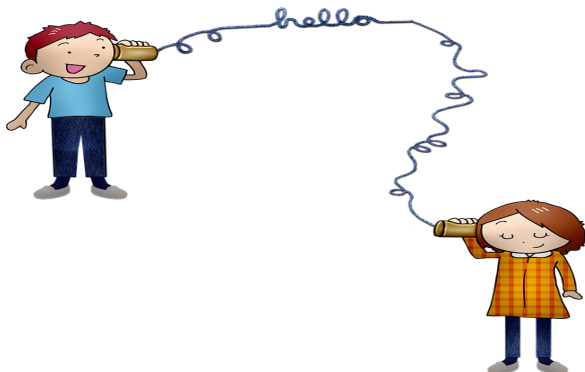

FORT ROAD - OLD CANADIAN TIRE BUILDING

To start, here is what is happening at the old Canadian Tire on Fort Road :)

In later half of 2022, the Edmonton North Primary Care Network, along with Addictions and Mental Health and Continuing Care branches of Alberta Health Services will be moving into the former Canadian Tire on Fort Road. This building will be called the Edmonton Community Health Hub North, which will provide a range of services focused on the following:

- *Addiction and mental health support*
- *Health promotion and disease prevention programming*
- *Continuing care and home care*
- *Non-acute care of people with complex health needs*

From the PCN side of things, our current location in Northgate mall will move all its services and staff to the new location. Our second location, Rundle Health Centre at 3427 – 118 Ave will remain where it is and will continue to see those patients on the community.

The two organizations will continue to operate independently as their own organizations (and by “independent” I mean there will still be patients seen for PCN services and patients seen for AHS services) but we believe being under one roof will help in increased collaboration and integration of services for patients and clients. Essentially one of us isn’t being “taken over” by the other. We are just moving in together in hopes of improving the delivery and coordination of care in the community for people in the Edmonton area.

AHS has a webpage called Together4Health which keeps members of the public and interested parties up-to-date on major timelines and development on their capital projects and we have committed to keeping that site up to date with information as it becomes available.

Hopefully that answers some initial questions that may be swirling around the community. Was there anything specific that came up at the community league meeting that I could address?
