This makes the importance of reporting, regardless of severity, absolutely vital for Edmonton Police Services, other vital services and your community!

9-1-1

This will connect you with police, fire and/or ambulance. Call for crimes in progress, for someone in serious distress, a fire or a medical emergency (including unconscious).

Call Police non-emergency

- to report a john
- suspicious person
- suspicious vehicle
- open drug use or deals
 - theft over \$5,000
- property or vehicle damage
 - victim of a scam

- dressed inappropriately for the weather
- sleeping in a stairwell, lobby or public place

3-1-1

This will connect you with the different city resources

- nuisance properties
- discarded needles
 - graffiti
- litter or garbage
- houseless encampments
- snow and ice on sidewalk
